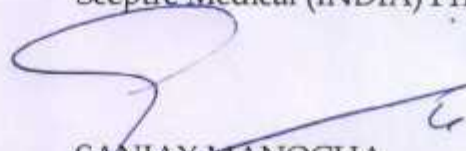

Report on the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Sceptre Medical India Private Limited** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2023, and the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2023, and profit for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

The Annexure referred to in Independent Auditors' Report to the members of the Company on the standalone financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2023, we report that:

(i)	In respect of its Property, Plant & Equipment
a.	The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars including quantitative details and situation of Property, Plant and Equipment and relevant details of right of use assets. The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars of intangible assets.
b.	The Company has a program of physical verification of Property, Plant and Equipment and right-of-use assets so to cover all the assets once every three years which, in our opinion, is reasonable having regard to the size of the Company and the nature of its assets. Pursuant to all the program, certain Property, Plant and Equipment were due for verification during the year the year and were physically verified by the Management during the year. According to the information and explanation given to us, no material discrepancies were noticed on such verification.
c.	According to the information and explanations given to us and on the basis of our examination of the records of the Company, the title deeds of immovable properties are held in the name of the Company.
d.	The Company has not revalued any of its Property, Plant and Equipment and intangible assets during the year.
e.	No proceeding has been initiated during the year or are pending against the Company as at March 31, 2023 for holding benami property under the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act, 1988 (as amended in 2016) and rules made thereon.
ii	In respect of its inventories

1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Corporate Information

Sceptre Medical (India) Private Limited("the Company) was incorporated on 24th June, 2010 under the Companies Act,1956 as a Private Limited Company. The Company is engage in the business of medical devices, medical equipment, surgical items, surgical equipment, pathological/laboratory items and other related goods.

1.2 Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principals in india under the historical cost convention on accrual basis. Pursuant to section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014, till the standards of accounting or any addendum thereto are prescribed by central Government in consultantion and recommendation of the National Financial Reporting Authority, the existing Accounting Standards notified under the Companies Act, 1956 shall to apply. Consequently, these financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards notified under section 211(3C) of Companies ACT, 1956 (Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules 2006, as amended) and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013

1.3 Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statement requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recongnised in the period in which the results are known/materialised.

1.4 Cash and Cash equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks, Cash equivalents are short term,highly liquid investments that are readily convertiable into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

1.5 Cash Flow Statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect menthmethod, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non cash nature and any defceerals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financial activities of the company are segregated based on the available information.



1.6 Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation/ amortisation. Costs includes all expenses incurred to bring the assets to its present location and condition.

1.7 Depreciation and Amortisation

Depreciation on Property, Plant & Equipment is provided to the extent of depreciation amount on Stright Line Method (SLM) over the estimated useful life of the Assets in the manner prescribed in Schedule II of the Act, as against the earlier practice of depreciating at the rates prescribed in Schedule XIV of companies Act 1956,

Effective from 1st April 2014, the Company depreciates its fixed assets over the useful life

Depreciation on additions to assets or on sale / discardment of assets, is calculated prorata basis from the month of such addition or upto the month of such sale/discardment, as the case may be.

1.8 Impairment of Assets

An Asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of assets exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged in Profit & Loss Account in the year in which an assets is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognised in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

1.9 Foreign Currency Transactions

Purchases and Services revenue are accounted at daily rates. Exchange Fluctuations arising on payment or on realization are dealt with in the Statement of Profit & Loss. Monetary Assets and Monetary Liabilities are restated at the year end closing rate and any difference arising thereof has been dealt with in the statement of Profit & Loss to the extent its pertains to the current year.

1.10 Investments

Current Investments are carried at lower of cost and quoted/ fair value, computed category wise. Long Term Investment are stated at cost. Provisions for diminution in the value of long-term investment is made only if such a decline is other than temporary.

1.11 Inventories

Items of inventories are measured at lower of cost and net realisable value after providing for obsolescence, if any.



1.12 Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized only when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection. Revenue from operations includes sale of goods, services, sales tax, service tax, excise duty and sales during trial run period, adjustment for discounts (net), Value Added Tax (VAT) and gain/loss on corresponding hedge contracts. Dividend Income is recognised when right to receive is established. Interest income is recognised on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

1.13 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All

1.14 Earning Per Share

Basic Earning per Share is computed by dividing Profit after tax (including the post tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the number of equity share outstanding during the year.

1.15 Provisions for Current and Deferred Tax

Provisions for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax resulting from "timing difference" between taxable and accounting income is accounted using the tax rates and laws that are enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets is recognised and carried forward only to the extent that there is a virtual certainty that the asset will be realised in future

1.16 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognised but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.
